INTRODUCTION

To determine if the work program is balanced and financially feasible, the "Net Available Revenue" minus the "Funded Projects Costs* should sum to zero for "Remaining Funds".

If the "Remaining Funds" balance is zero, then the plan is both balanced and financially feasible.

If the "Remaining Funds" balance is negative, then the plan is neither balanced nor feasible.

If the "Remaining Funds" balance is greater than zero, the plan may be feasible, but it is not balanced.
