

# MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF CITY COMMISSIONERS FOR THE CITY OF PORT ST. JOE, FLORIDA, HELD AT 2775 GARRISON AVENUE, March 15, 2022, at Noon.

The following were present: Mayor Buzzett, Commissioners Ashbrook, Langston, and Lowry. City Manager Jim Anderson, City Clerk Charlotte Pierce, and City Attorney Clinton McCahill were also present. Commissioner Hoffman was absent.

#### **CONSENT AGENDA**

#### **Minutes**

A Motion was made by Commissioner Ashbrook, second by Commissioner Langston, to approve the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of March 1, 2022. All in favor; Motion carried 4-0.

Mr. McCahill read Form 8B Memorandum of Voting Conflict For County, Municipal, and Other Local Public Offices as completed by Commissioners Ashbrook and Hoffman on March 1, 2022, concerning Ordinance 597 Food Trucks. Commissioner Ashbrook abstained from voting because he works for a company with an interest in utilizing food trucks on a contract landlord / tenant basis. Commissioner Hoffman abstained from voting because is the bookkeeper of his brother's Food Truck Business.

#### **Planning Board Recommendations**

Development Order Request – Palmetto Bluff Subdivision 90 Units Long Avenue Partners, LLC

Commissioner Lowry stated that he would be abstaining from voting on this issue because he has a business interest with developer Ralph Rish.

A Motion was made by Commissioner Ashbrook, second by Commissioner Langston, to grant the Development Order dependent upon the completion of the attached contingencies. See Ex. (A). All in favor; Motion carried 3-0 with Commissioner Lowry abstaining.

#### City Engineer - Josh Baxley

Long Avenue Water / Sewer Project Change Order #3

This project is under construction. Crews are currently working on the water main and sewer force main on Long Avenue.

Change Order #3 is to remove and replace the ring and cover on 30 manholes and replace 6" VCP with 8" PVC on Long Avenue.

Mayor Buzzett expressed his concerns and noted that the City will be required to pay 20% of the \$148,000 cost and feels that Dewberry should have caught this error in the bid. He asked Mr. Baxley if Dewberry would cover the cost and Mr. Baxley said he would ask about this.

Change Order #4 will be a deductive Chane Order for City direct equipment purchases and tax savings.

First Street Sewer Repairs and Paving

Bids are due March 24, 2022, for this project.

Clifford Sims Park Plan

Bids for this project are due on April 8, 2022.

Observation Platform – The plans indicate a 38' long by 8' wide aluminum walkway connected to a 70' x 18' aluminum observation platform. The structure will be supported by prestressed concrete pilings and girders.

#### Boat Ramp Access Road Design

Plans are in design for this project and Dewberry expects to have a 60% review set by the week of March 21, 2022.

Commissioner Langston asked about the dust and broken road piles across from Mama Dot's and the Farmacy on Avenue A. Mr. Anderson shared that the contractor is moving the dirt daily and it should be gone shortly.

#### City Attorney -

Attorney McCahill did not have anything to report.

#### **Old Business**

City Projects

Mr. Anderson noted the completion of Knowles Avenue; the pavilion provided by the Port St. Joe Rotary Club has been installed on the Florida Forever Land across from the Methodist Church, the Keepers' House, Elgin, has been completed, and the point repair on First Street is finished.

#### New Business -

Florida Resilient Cities

The walking tour is scheduled for Friday, March 18, 2022, at 9 A.M.

Mr. Anderson announced that Fire Chief, John Ford, is retiring after 32 years and thanked him for his service. Mayor Buzzett asked that Chief Ford be recognized in a meeting for his years of service.

#### Public Works - John Grantland

Mr. Grantland did not have any updates for the Commission.

#### Surface Water Plant - Larry McClamma

Mr. McClamma was running the plant and unable to attend the meeting. Mr. Anderson noted that two reports had been received from DEP and were very good. The Quarterly Disinfectant By Products Report was very low, and the CCR Report passed for the year and will be distributed shortly.

#### Wastewater Plant – Kevin Pettis

Mr. Pettis shared that Mr. McClamma and the Surfacewater Treatment Plant has a new vehicle and there is 3.5' of freeboard in the lagoon. He also noted that the Sonic Disrupters did not pass the manufactures test and have not been shipped yet; the pump for the Headworks has been ordered and he will be working on bid specs for the platform for it. The plant will be pushing water this month; Algae continues to be in the lagoon and he is preparing a plan of action letter to DEP for controlling the Algae.

#### Finance Director - Mike Lacour

Mr. Lacour is working on required replacement signs for Maddox Park and Clifford Sims Park.

Mayor Buzzett asked about the City's entrance sign that had once been at Windmark.

#### Code Enforcement -

Mr. Anderson shared that several cases heard by the Special Master have a time line for compliance and multiple notices have been issued for campers.

#### Police Department - Lt. Burch

Lt. Burch did not have anything to report from the Police Department.

#### City Clerk - Charlotte Pierce

Grants Update

Ms. Pierce shared that Staff continues to meet with the City's grant writing team and explore grants for the City.

She noted the FY 2023 Community Planning Technical Assistance Grant that Commissioner Langston inquired about has an April 11, 2022, deadline and will require approximately \$10,000 in funding. Commissioner Langston will get with Commissioner Ashbrook to see if the PSJRA could help with this.

Clerk Pierce noted that the Grant Agreement was signed by Mayor Buzzett for the Centennial Building and she anticipates the Grant Agreement for the Cape San Blas Lighthouse Complex will be signed soon.

#### Citizens to be Heard -

Chester Davis reminded the Commissioners of the walk through with UF Friday and shared that he would be using his church van to transport participants if there is bad weather.

He noted the continued use of his church property for a dumping site near the Lasharaw Apartments and asked what could be done. It was noted that the church property and apartments are on private property and the issue needs to be resolved by the owners.

Mr. Davis also asked if the dirt being hauled from in front of Mama Dot's could be used by NPSJ residents rather than trucking the dirt to Blountstown. Mayor Buzzett reminded Mr. Davis that this would be between a private contactor and residents and those entities would need to discuss this issue.

#### **Discussion Items by Commissioners**

Commissioner Lowry shared that the TDC would be contributing \$10,000 for fireworks this year.

Commissioner Ashbrook asked about the status of funding for a new City Hall. Staff is working with the City Architect and he is in the process of preparing a PAR.

Commissioner Langston did not have anything to update the Commission on.

Mayor Buzzett reported that his meeting with Gulf County Board of County Commissioners Chairman Sandy Quinn went well. Commissioner Quinn is aware of the need for the Field of Dreams and will try to move forward on this issue. Mayor Buzzett anticipates that a contingency from the little league program will be approaching the County Commission as there are over 200 participants in the program this year. He also referenced an article in the FL Trend Magazine of the tremendous growth expected in the remainder of this decade and how it will impact our area.

Mayor Buzzett and Mr. Anderson met with Jorge Gonzalez of the St. Joe Company recently and Mayor Buzzett stated he felt good about the meeting. They discussed the marina, adding landscaping to enhance the storage barn, motel projects, paving of Marina Drive, and possible traffic issues on Highway 98 with the 700 new homes being built there. A meeting has been scheduled for the City, St. Joe Company, and FDOT to discuss the traffic issue. It was noted that the fencing on Marina Drive was requested by Eastern Shipbuilding to protect their property. There is a meeting Thursday to discuss the Town Home rentals to be built on Highway 71 and the possibility of the City providing water and sewer for them.

Your responsibilities under the law when faced with voting on a measure in which you have a conflict of interest will vary greatly depending on whether you hold an elective or appointive position. Dear Mr. Anderson,

Please see my response to the items of concern you provided to Caleb Brown with Dewberry via email on February 25, 2022.

1. Development Order Application Fee. Fee has been provided to the City.

2. Easement and/or legal on the plans for the line between the subdivision and Sacred Heart

Sacred Heart has agreed to reinstate the sewer easement down the Eastern Boundary. Prior to constructing the off-site sewer improvements, we will provide proof of the easement to the City.

B. Easement between lots 74 & 75 are still a concern.

Removing the easement between lots 74 & 75 and separating the lot lines would cause the two lots to not meet the requirements on the recorded P.U.D. for minimum lot frontage. Ultimately, this would result in the loss of the two subject lots. However, the plat will describe the easement as a utility easement dedicated to the utility owners. Furthermore, the covenants and restrictions will place the property owners with the responsibility of removing or replacing improvements within the easement.

4. Letter saying the developer will guarantee the sacred heart lift station will achieve 250 gpm and the City must be provided an official start-up report by Dewberry prior to any C.O.

As you are aware, Dewberry is currently designing upgrades to the Sacred Heart Lift Station as the subject development's wastewater system will tie into the lift station. Prior to a C.O. being issued, we will ensure the lift station upgrades have been completed and conduct a start up to ensure achievement of the 250 GPM flow requirement. We will provide an official start-up report to the City for verification.



#### **ORDINANCE 597**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PORT ST. JOE, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE CITY OF PORT ST. JOE LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS BY CREATING ARTICLE IX, "MOBILE FOOD DISPENSING VEHICLES"; PROVIDING REGULATIONS FOR MOBILE FOOD DISPENSING VEHICLES OPERATING WITHIN THE CITY; ESTABLISHING A ZONE **OPERATION** OF FOR MOBILE DISPENSING VEHICLES; **ESTABLISHING** PROHIBITIONS; ESTABLISHING OPERATING REQUIREMENTS; ESTABLISHING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Florida signed into law the Occupational Freedom and Opportunity Act (SB474/HB1171) ("Act"), which became effective on July 1, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Act created Florida Statutes Section 509.102-Mobile Food Dispensing Vehicle ("MFDV") preemption in which a municipality, county or other local government entity may not require a separate license, registration, permit or fee from MFDVs and may not prohibit MFDVs from operating within the entirety of the jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the City currently does not have an ordinance or regulation specifically regulating MFDVs and has relied on other Land Development Regulations to regulate them; and

WHEREAS, MFDVs can provide opportunities for entrepreneurs and small businesses to startup and operate at relatively low cost. They may add interest, vibrancy, and activity to the City. However, without proper regulation they can have potentially negative effects by posing a threat to brick-and-mortar restaurants, blocking of public rights-of-way, creating traffic, negatively impacting the function and flow of parking facilities, posing a fire risk and life safety risk, etc.; and

WHEREAS, THE City Commission held public workshops on January 18, 2022 and February 22, 2022, to provide recommendations regarding the regulation of MFDVs; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission finds it is in the best interest of health, safety, and the welfare of the public to adopt standards for the location and operation of MFDVs within the City to address and mitigate the potential negative effects as recited above; and

WHEREAS, the City of Port St. Joe finds and determines that this addition to the City's Land Development Regulations are consistent with all applicable policies including the Land Development Regulations and the City's adopted Comprehensive Plan and not in conflict with public interest.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PORT ST. JOE, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. The foregoing whereas clauses are incorporated herein as legislative findings by this reference and made a part hereof for all intents and purposes.

#### SECTION 2. DEFINTIONS:

Mobile Food Dispensing Vehicles. Is a vehicle that is a public food service establishment and is self-propelled or otherwise moveable from place to place and includes self-contained utilities, including, but not limited to gas, water, electricity, or liquid waste disposal, sometimes referred to as a food truck or trailer or food cart, and otherwise regulated by the Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR) requiring a mobile food vendor license subject to F.S. Section 509.102 and in compliance with this Ordinance. Mobile Food Dispensing Vehicles are stationary for periods greater than 10 minutes while foodstuffs are prepared, served and/or sold. A Mobile Food Dispensing Vehicle does not include roving vehicles, like ice cream truck, that periodically travel through residential neighborhoods selling preprepared or prepackaged food items, or street peddler of unprepared foodstuffs, makeshift, standalone restaurants or buffets such as a food tent, or mobile vendor selling anything other than food/foodstuffs.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance is added to the City's Land Development Regulations to regulate MFDVs within the City limits as follows:

- A. Mobile Food Dispensing Vehicles. This Ordinance applies to vendors operating MFDVs as defined in Florida Statute and herein can operate in compliance with the following requirements:
  - 1. Provide a copy of the following documents to the City:
    - a. The Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DPBR) mobile food dispensing license.
    - b. A notarized authorization of property owner permitting the operations of a food truck on eligible private property. The authorization shall include a phone number contact for the property owner and an acknowledgment the owner shall be responsible for any infractions associated with the food truck operator/owner including a fine of no less than \$500.00 per infraction.
    - c. A notarized affidavit attesting that all sales tax collected within the city limits of Port St. will be remitted to the Florida Department of Revenue as collected in Gulf County, Florida.
  - 2. A site plan at least a scale of 1" = 100' depicting the location of the truck in relation to all on-site improvements including buildings, drive aisles, parking places, pedestrian facilities, etc. The site plan shall depict all property

boundaries, parking on site, driveway cuts, buildings and improvements and related dimensions as applicable. The basis for the site plan can be a scaled aerial photo downloaded from the internet.

- 3. In order to provide a high level of food safety, the Vendor shall provide a menu of food or list of food stuffs being sold.
- 4. Location Standards.
  - a. MFDVs may operate on property developed with existing, active commercial use in Mixed Use zoning districts. Vacant, undeveloped lots/parcels or non-active commercial use areas are not eligible for MFDV operation.
  - b. Commercially zoned properties used principally for residential are not eligible.
  - c. MFDVs may be allowed within an PUD zoned and commercially/industrially developed properties if a food truck is listed as permitted use within the associated Development Agreement.
  - d. Actively used and developed house of worship properties, regardless of zoning classification, may be used for MFDVs consistent with the requirements set forth in this Ordinance unless there are specific conditions prohibiting or regulating mobile food dispensing activities under an approved Conditional Use.
  - e. MFDVs must be placed on a paved surface only.
  - f. MFDVs shall not be located within any public right-of-way or otherwise obstruct any drive aisle, driveway throat, or cross access area associated with any parking facility or obstruct any sight triangle or otherwise be situated in an unsafe manner.
  - g. MFDVs may not be located at eligible facilities where parking is not adequate to serve the business facility as per the Land development Regulations.
  - h. MFDVs may not occupy, obstruct/impede access to any handicapped parking spots.
  - i. MFDVs may not set up tents, chairs or tables.
  - j. MFDVs and related operations shall be consistent with the Florida Fire Prevention Code to include, but not limited to, the following:
    - i. MFDVs shall not be less than 10 feet from all buildings;

- ii. MFDVs shall not be less than 10 feet from all other vehicles;
- iii. MFDVs shall not be less than 10 feet from combustible materials;
- iv. Access to fire lanes and/or fire prevention devices shall be maintained;
- v. L/P gas and generator storage and use shall be consistent with the Florida fire Prevention Code;
- vi. The location and/or operation of the MFDVs inconsistent with any of the above provisions shall be enforced via the City Code Enforcement procedures.
- 5. MFDVs shall not be associated with any hazardous or unsafe condition and shall not produce excess noise, vibration, electronic interference, excess heat ort glare, etc. Noise levels from a generator must not exceed manufacture specifications.
- 6. No more than one MFDV may operate on a single parcel of property unless part of a City Special Event where special event rules and regulations and permitting fees apply.
- Advertising will be limited to identifying copy depicted on a single vehicle or trailer engaged in the mobile vending activity. No signs, banners, flags, sandwich boards, or similar will be allowed in any City right-of-way or on private property- including all prohibited signs under Article VI of the Land Development Regulations. In no cases shall people hold signs, merchandise or attempt to advertise for a MFDV within a public right-of-way. In addition, no other attention getting devices such as lighting beyond normal illumination, music noise or scintillating lights or material shall be used in conjunction with any MFDV.
- B. Exemptions. MFDVs operating under an approved special event permit shall operate under the terms of the special event permit including date, hours of operation, location, and compliance with all codes as applicable.
- C. Enforcement. This Ordinance shall be enforced by the Port St. Joe Police Department and/or the City Code Enforcement Officer.

Any operator of a MFDV who violates any provision of this Ordinance will be required to immediately cease all operations and leave the location. If there is a refusal to comply with the cease-and-desist determination of the St. Joe Police Department, the Department may issue a citation to the Operator of the MFDV with a \$150.00 (one hundred and fifty dollar) fine/penalty, which will be issued and enforced pursuant to Chapter 316.1967 Florida Statutes in conjunction with the Gulf County Clerk of Court via Chapter 28.2402 Florida Statutes.

The provisions of this Ordinance may also be enforced against the landowner by the City of Port St. Joe code Enforcement Officer. MFDVs operating in non-compliance with any of the provisions herein will be required to immediately cease all operations. If there is a refusal to

comply with the cease-and-desist determination the City Code Enforcement Officer, he/or she shall follow the City Code Enforcement procedures to enforce this Ordinance against the landowner. The City's Special Magistrate for Code Enforcement may order up to a \$500.00 fine/penalty per each infraction.

SECTION 4. GRANDFATHER CLAUSE: The current owners of Gulf County Parcel ID No.: 05769-050R were previously granted permission from the City Commission to operate a MFDV on that specific parcel. They are hereby grandfathered in and will be allowed to continue operating the MFDV even in the event that that particular location does not meet with the requirements of this ordinance. However, upon the transfer of ownership of the parcel, whether that be from a sale or via inheritance or any other method of transfer, then this clause will immediately be voided, and the parcel will have to conform with all provisions of this ordinance to continue the operation of a MFDV.

SECTION 5. REPEAL: All ordinances or parts or ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY: If a Court of Competent jurisdiction shall hold any of the provisions hereof invalid the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final adoption by the City Commission of Port St. Joe, Florida.
