

RESOLUTION 2020-02

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PORT ST. JOE FOR ALL CITY EMPLOYEES WHO WORK DURING A STATE OF FLORIDA DECLARATION OF PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY AS DECLARED BY GOVERNOR RON DESANTIS EXECUTIVE ORDER 20-51 ON MARCH 1, 2020, FOR THE CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19).

WHEREAS, the City of Port St. Joe, Florida, recognizes that the City of Port St. Joe, County of Gulf, is prone to Public Health emergencies, floods, hurricanes, storms and other natural disasters, and;

WHEREAS, during such times of emergencies or other types of disaster, the City Commission of the City of Port St. Joe, Florida, or the Board of County Commission of Gulf County, Florida, may declare a state of emergency, and;

WHEREAS, during such declared state of emergency City employees may be called upon to secure the wellbeing of the residents of the City of Port St. Joe, and to protect the City property, and;

WHEREAS, such tasks often require the City employee to work more than 40 hours per week or more than 8 hours per day,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City of Port St. Joe, Florida that:

Any employee who works during a State of Emergency declared by either the City Commission of Port St. Joe, or the Board of County Commission of Gulf County, Florida, shall be entitled to overtime pay if the employee works more than 40 hours during the pay period in which the State of Emergency follows, or works more than 8 hours in any 24 hour period immediately before, during or after the State of Emergency.
